PROGRAMS TO KEEP YOU **WARM THIS WINTER**

As temperatures fall, monthly heating bills can go up. Here are some ways PGW may be able to help you stay warm without the worry.

Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) is a federal grant that helps low-income households pay their winter heating bills. Grants range from \$200 to \$1,000, are based on customer's income and household size, and DO NOT have to be repaid. Text FAST to 75308 to see if you're eligible.

Customer Responsibility Program (CRP) allows eligible customers to get a smaller PGW bill based on household size and income. CRP customers can even eliminate past-due charges while still saving money. Visit pgworks.com for an application.

Are you without gas service? Do you have broken heating equipment? Crisis assistance can help. The Crisis program is a federal grant awarded to income-eligible customers. A Crisis grant can be combined with LIHEAP to help keep - or restore - gas service this

winter. Call the PA Department of Human Services at 215-560-1583 to learn if you qualify, for a list of needed documentation, and more details.

Utility Emergency Services Fund (UESF) grants are designed to pay off the balance of a customer's utility bill. It is available to income-eligible customers who are behind on their utility bills, or are currently without service. The maximum UESF grant amount is \$1,500 and available after all public sources of support have been exhausted. Customers must apply in person at a UESF Intake Site. Visit pgworks.com for a list of locations.

If you've fallen behind on your PGW bill, you may be eligible to enroll in a PGW payment arrangemenent. Call 215-235-1000 to talk to our Customer Care Team about this and other assistance programs.


PGW STRENGTHENS COMMUNITY THROUGH IINITFN WAY DRIVF

While you gather with friends and family over meals prepared with love (and natural gas!) this holiday season, keep yourself safe!

U.S. fire departments respond to an average of 166,100 home fires per year related to cooking and food preparation, according to the National Fire Protection Association. Make sure your home isn't one of them with these safety tips.

- Keep anything that can catch fire oven mitts, wooden utensils, towels, aprons and food packages - away from your stovetop.
- · Stay in the kitchen while frying, boiling, grilling or broiling food.
- · Turn pot handles toward the back of the stove.
- · If you have little ones at home, establish a "kid-free zone" of at least three feet around the
- stove, oven and any areas where hot food or drink is being prepared or carried.
- · Never leave the house while food is cooking.
- In the event of an oven grease fire, immediately turn off the oven and keep the oven door closed.
- If you have any doubt about extinguishing a fire of any size - leave your home immediately and call 9-1-1.
