One of the simplest things you can do is sign up for Ready Philadelphia alerts. **To receive notices about emergencies or severe weather, simply go to www.phila.gov/ready.** There you can select the types of information you want delivered by text, email, or voicemail. Developing an emergency plan helps your family members know what to do in case an emergency occurs.

Here are some things to consider:

- Keep important documents insurance, financial, health and legal paperwork – stored in a fireproof and waterproof box or safe.
- Make sure you have cash available because ATMs may not be available if a disaster hits.
- Develop a way to contact family members to let them know you're safe.

Taking time to prepare before an emergency happens can ease your stress and worries as you recover.
