Need more than LIHEAP this season?

Look to Crisis, UESF, and PGW assistance programs.

Have you applied for or received a Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP) grant, but need more assistance? Learn three more ways PGW can help:



Crisis Grant

Are you without gas service? Do you have a 10-day shut-off notice? Do you have broken heating equipment? A Crisis Grant can help.

Crisis, a federal grant awarded to income-eligible customers, can be combined with LIHEAP to help keep – or restore – gas service this winter.

You must apply for the grant in person at the Philadelphia County Assistance Office (1348 W. Sedgley Avenue) and have required documentation.

Call (215) 560-1583 to see if you qualify, a list of needed documentation, and more details.

Utility Emergency Services Fund (UESF)

Is your gas service off? A UESF grant, reserved for income-eligible customers, may be available to you.

UESF grants up to \$1,500 are designed to help pay off the balance of an unpaid utility bill, allowing service to be restored, and can be combined with both LIHEAP and Crisis.

A UESF grant will only be available if, along with other assistance, any match by PGW and a customer's own payment bring the account balance to zero. For complete details and an application, call (215) 972-5170, or visit www.uesf.org

Third-party notification service available

PGW offers customers the option to enroll in a third-party shut-off notification program. If an enrolled customer receives a shut-off notice, PGW will also send a copy of the notice to a designated caregiver, family member or organization. Third-party recipients will not receive copies of monthly bills or other private customer information, and are not responsible for paying bills.

No increase to PGW natural gas rates

PGW customers will not see an increase in natural gas rates this winter, as announced on December 1, 2013. The natural gas rate reflects what PGW pays for the gas.

The rate will stay in effect through February 2014. At that time, PGW will determine, based on market conditions, whether the rate should change.

The Public Utility Commission recently announced that PGW customers are among the two-thirds of Pennsylvania's natural gas users who paid the lowest gas rates, for December, in a decade.
