Energy tips to help keep cool

We're always looking for ways to be more efficient and sharing those tips with our neighbors. Here are a few. We invite you to learn more at pgwenergysense.com.

- Use appliances in early morning or evening, when temperatures are lower.
- Turn off fans when you leave a room. Fans help keep you cool, but most don't lower temperatures.
- Lower your water heater's thermostat. According to the US Department of Energy, lowering it by 10 degrees can save up to 5 percent in energy costs.

Avoid the need for expensive repairs by keeping your heater pilot on year-round. Keeping the pilot lit – even on hot summer days – will keep your heater parts dry, rust-free and ready for when cold weather returns.
